When the disaster is declared, Consolidated Emergency Assistance Program (CEAP) will authorize the Disaster Cash Assistance Program (DCAP) to provide funds for families and individuals with or without children who have suffered losses as a result of the disaster. The following applies to DCAP: The applicant had to have been living in the declared disaster area before the disaster happened. Having a vacation home does not count for residency. The applicant must have suffered a loss of income or property as a result of the disaster. The CEAP income rules apply to DCAP. See WAC 388-436-0045. The applicant must apply for any other assistance available, such as:
